STYLE SECRETS
 Get Stacy's look with these tips and tricks

ON SHOW
 Display family photographs in a gallery arrangement. Position pictures above a large item of furniture such as a sofa or bed, which will provide an anchor point, and place the images so that they fill up most of the space.

SHADES OF GREY
 Finding just the right hue of this popular colour can be tricky. Knowing how the light works in your space will help. In a north-facing room, avoid cool greys with a green or grey base, which can make the room feel chilly. Instead, go for warmer tones with hints of pink, gold or yellow. Warm and cool tones work equally well in south-facing rooms.
